Jim Masterman – Self-Appointed Chief Technology Officer of Rutherford Cemetery

Jim Masterman didn't know it while painting the fence at Rutherford Cemetery in the 1960's, but one day he would attain the esteemed title of Chief Technology Officer (CTO). Rutherford Cemetery was only 1/2 mile away from where Jim grew up near the family farm in Stillwater, MN. In fact, the Masterman's are original plot owners that helped create the cemetery. The land was on a small hill that wasn't good for farming anyway, so about 16 of the local settlers and farmers established Rutherford in 1850. Jim helped clean up the cemetery each spring which gave him a leg up on the competition when he received his first paying job as the official grass mower which paid a whopping \$2 an hour which Jim said, "...was the highest paying job I had for years". After a long career working for the 3M Company, as an engineer, Jim jumped back in the saddle by becoming a board member of Rutherford and eventually becoming the self-proclaimed CTO.

Benefits Jim enjoys while in his position as CTO include the freedom to help Rutherford Cemetery in a variety of ways. With his background as a mechanical and electrical engineer, Jim brings unique experience to the table and is a natural go-getter. One of the first projects Jim tackled sprouted from a walk he took through the grounds at Rutherford which he had done so many times before. He noticed that markers for lots were difficult to discern. Jim dove deep into the issue of burial records and mapping lot locations and created a custom computer database to not only map the cemetery in Microsoft Excel, but to also keep precise documentation of each lot by linking the map to an individual record. Jim went a step further. He donated his own money and hired a company that used ground penetrating radar (GPR) and found 20 unmarked burials in the oldest part

of the cemetery from the 1850's. Jim admitted that he hoped for more from the GPR survey, but finding those lots only in the oldest section of the cemetery was helpful since no new sales would occur there. As CTO he also dove into financial records again using Excel to organize the information. He also reinstated the tax-exempt status for the cemetery which Jim said with



a bit of sarcasm, "...after only 6 months we recovered our status." Jim has a keen eye for a good-looking cemetery and again donated his time, money, and energy to landscaping with an attractive two-tiered boulder wall in front, one tier on the north side by the flag pole and new steps in each location. He's also currently working to install hand railings by the steps. Needless to say, Jim has taken his job as CTO seriously and paved the way for a more organized, smoother running, and better-looking cemetery.

Jim poured his time, energy, and passion into Rutherford Cemetery to help everyone enjoy remembering our loved ones who have passed on. Jim says he enjoys walking the cemetery grounds looking at names and dates. Jim said, "I always find the dates interesting, with a little arithmetic I can see how old the person was..." He notes, "Many of them were not particularly old." It was a different time living in, "A world lit only by fire". Rutherford is an extension of Jim's passion for history. It's a good reminder to follow our passions and use our strengths, as Jim has, to make a difference in our world and a little cemetery called Rutherford. Thank you, Jim, for all you've done as you're an inspiration to us all!
